**Applications** Office (CAO) The Central processes applications for admissions to all universities, universities of technology, most private and five TVET colleges in KwaZulu-Natal. Our participating institutions offer over 900 programmes, and with just ONE APPLICATION FORM, you can apply for up to six programmes at any of our partner institutions. You do not need to complete a separate application for each institution. You only have to pay ONE APPLICATION FEE and when you want to update or change your application to any of the institutions in this Handbook, there is one office to contact.

#### **Need Financial Aid?**

The University provides a number of bursaries to its students, subject to students meeting all bursary requirements. Please note that approval for a NSFAS loan or any bursary does not imply admission to study at UNIZULU or vice versa.

#### Applying for NSFAS

The National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) has implemented an online system where students may apply for funding. The NSFAS application form is easily accessible on the UNIZULU website at www.unizulu.ac.za/ On the home page, click "Student Zone" and select "Apply". At the bottom of that page will be a download link to the NSFAS application form. Alternatively, students can visit www.nsfas.org.za.

#### **Bursaries for Language Practice Studies**

An initiative of the national Department of Arts and Culture, this bursary is awarded to undergraduate or postgraduate students enrolled for Language Practice courses. The specific objective of the bursary award is for successful applicants to acquire skills

in any three of the following areas of study: Translation and Editing; Interpreting; Lexicography; Terminology Development and Management; Language Planning; Human Language Technologies; any of the South African official languages with emphasis on indigenous languages and South African Sign Language. Applications are made directly to UNIZULU via its Department of General Linguistics and Modern Languages.

#### Funza Lushaka

The Funza Lushaka Bursary is a full bursary for Bachelor of Education students offered by the Department of Basic Education (DBE).

The application period for the bursary is between September and January for first-time applicants.

District Based Funza is a full bursary that selects matric students

### 3. Important Notice and Terms and Conditions

- 1. Complete and Submit your application to us as soon as possible.
- We process applications for our member institutions from 1 March for the following year's January (First Semester) intake. We process applications for member universities that have a Second Semester intake from August for the following year's July (Second Semester) intake
- In addition to Semester Programmes, TVET colleges also offer trimester programmes. Applications for these will be received at various points in the year. See the CAO website for details, or call us for more information, or call the TVET College directly.
- 4. If you are currently in Grade 12, you must submit your;
  - 4.1 Final Grade 11 Results and;
  - 4.2 a certified copy of your ID with your application.
  - 4.3 After June, you must also submit your mid-year results and after September, you must also submit your Grade 12 Trials results.
    - We add each result and document to your original application and make copies of all your documents as we receive them and make them available to all the institutions to which you apply. If, after you have submitted your original application you inform us that you have changed your email address or cellphone number or residential address, we make the necessary changes on your original application and inform the institutions to which you have applied.
- If you are not currently in Grade 12, but have completed Grade 12 previously, you must apply as early in the year preceding the year of entry by:
  - 5.1 Completing and submitting your application together with;
  - 5.2 a certified copy of your Grade 12 Statement of Results or National Senior Certificate:

- 5.3 a certified copy of your ID. If you don't have a copy of your ID you must provide your ID number on the online or hard copy application and submit a certified copy of your ID as soon as you receive it.
- 5.4 If you are applying to a TVET college, you must send a certified copy of results of the last grade you have passed at school.
- 5.5 If you have upgraded one or more of your subjects, send us a certified copy of your Combined Statement/Certificate of Results.
- 6. Institutions inform us that the earlier in the year you apply, the earlier you are considered for a place.
- 7. Make sure that the ID number and name and surname you use on your application form is exactly the same as the one you use when you register for your Final Grade 12 Examination. If it differs, we will not be able to download your final examination results from the Department of Basic Education (DBE) database and match them to your application information at the institution.
- 8. An application is considered to be valid only once the full application (hard copy or online), including the programme choices, signed Declaration and Informed Consent as well as the full application fee has been received by the CAO. Only then will it be processed and made available to institutions.
- 9. The official Received Date for the application will be the date on which the completed application - with programme choices, full payment, declaration and informed consent has been received. Applicant and application information will be sent to institutions only once these terms and conditions have been met.
- 10. Application and Change of Mind fees are not refundable.
- 11. Please provide the correct email and cell phone number as all messages are sent to you by email/SMS. We can only communicate


- messages with you via email if you have supplied an email address and via cell if no email address is provided (the email/cell phone number that you provide on your original application form or the one you may have changed via written communication with us and that we have confirmed that it has been changed).
- 12. At four weeks after we receive your valid application, we will send you an Acknowledgement Letter by email in which we acknowledge that we have received and processed your application form. If no email address is provided, the communication will be sent by fax, and if no fax numbers are provided, letters will be sent by post. Applicants are encouraged to use a valid email address for communication since this is the quickest and most reliable way that you will receive letters. Posting letters is a last resort. See Electronic Communications and Transactions Act, 2002 on www. gov.za regarding emailed documents.
- 13. The Acknowledgement Letter will have all the details you have provided on your application. Applicants are fully responsible for checking their Acknowledgement Letters and informing the CAO of any errors, omissions or changes.
- 14. If you do not inform us of errors, omissions, or changes within two weeks after we have sent you the Acknowledgement Letter, we shall accept that all the information in the Acknowledgement Letter is correct and as complete as you want it to be.
- 15. If you have not received an Acknowledgement Letter within four weeks after you have applied, please enquire if the CAO has received your application. (See page 3 for contact details).
- 16. We provide your information to institutions electronically. The institutions have full and final responsibility for selection and admission decisions, not the CAO.
- 17. Selection decisions we receive from institutions we pass on to applicants as soon as we receive them from the institutions. The

- institutions may also contact the applicant directly.
- 18. Institutions start making offers early in the year preceding the year of entry. It is in your best interest to submit your valid application as early as possible.
- 19. You will receive an SMS, a letter (either by email, fax or post) to inform you of any offers that you have been made by an institution to which you have applied. Try your best to have an email address to which we can send offer letters as institutions often have a cut-off date for receiving from the applicant confirmation of the acceptance of an offer. If the offer is not accepted within the stipulated period the institution reserves the right to withdraw the offer.
- 20. Offers to study may be withdrawn if:
  - You don't within the period stipulated by the institution tell the institution you want to accept the offer or;
  - · The conditions of the offer are not met; and/or
  - The institution discovers that you have provided false information in your application, e.g. you have not declared that you have previously studied at that or another institution.
- 21. You will only receive either an email or SMS to inform you that you have been unsuccessful for any of the programme choices you applied for.
- 22. Applicants should apply and pay on or before the published closing dates. Applications received after these dates will be considered as Late Applications and each institution has its own rules and procedures on how they deal with applications received after the closing date.
- 23. If, after you have applied, you want to change your qualifications/ programme choices, you may complete a Change of Mind Request Form (COM) and choose different qualifications/programmes. These forms can be downloaded from our website or requested from our Call Centre.

- 24. A COM will only be processed once we have received the COM fee (See page 171 for fee structure).
- 25. Any number of programme changes/additions (up to six programmes) on the same Change of Mind Request Form is considered as one for payment purposes.
- 26. If you submit qualification/programme changes/additions on more than one Change of Mind Request Form and/or at different times, each Change of Mind Request Form submission will be regarded as a separate request and a fee must be paid for each submission, not for each qualification/programme change.
- Payment/s for multiple COM Request Form submissions will be allocated and processed strictly in the sequence that the COM Request Forms were received.
- 28. Every attempt has been made to ensure that the information in this Handbook is accurate and up to date at the time of going to print. However, institutions continually update their programmes and entry requirements.
- 29. During the course of the year, institutions may make available new programmes that were not finalised in time to be included in this Handbook check our website www.cao.ac.za, Facebook page or contact our Call Centre on 0860 860 226 or 031 268 4444 for updates. At the time of going to print, only a few skills training and learnership programmes were included in this Handbook. Please check the website or contact us during the course of the year to find out about other available TVET skills training and learnership programmes or contact the TVET College directly.
- 30. An entry in this Handbook does not oblige the institution to offer the programme as institutions continually assess their programmes and may decide to discontinue programmes during an application cycle. If an institution discontinues a programme that is published

- in this Handbook, the applicant may change such a programme at no cost to them.
- 31. Specified entry requirements are guidelines used by institutions and each institution sets its own minimum entry requirements.
- 32. Entry requirements published in the Handbook are MINIMUM requirements for your application to be considered; and in most cases, the number of applications for a qualification/programme far exceeds the number of places that an institution has available for the qualification/programme. Therefore, while you may meet the published minimum entry requirements, it does not guarantee acceptance.
- 33. All payments to the CAO is done through EasyPay or by providing us with the information requested as item labelled "O" on the application form or pay online at www.CAO.ac.za and click on 'My Application'. The CAO does not take responsibility for payments in any other manner.
- 34. These programmes are indicated by '3/4 yrs' in the Programme Choice List under 'duration'.

#### Institutions with places to fill may contact you directly

Private colleges and other institutions request details of applicants who may be interested in studying with them. You may be approached to see if you are interested in a particular programme.

#### Mid-year entry point

Some programmes have a second semester (mid-year) intake of students during the year. You will find this information under 'entry term' in the Programme Choice List as explained on page 17 or on the CAO website www.cao.ac.za. TVET colleges also have trimester entry for Nated ('N') programmes and skills programmes.

#### **Extending your application forward to next year**

You will be allowed to extend your 2019 application into 2020 provided you complete a Change of Mind Request Form (see page 203) which must reach us by 31 March 2019. Thereafter, you will need to make a new application.

If you have been 'regretted' for any of your choices, check the entry requirements before applying to the same programmes again.

### 2. TVET College Study

Technical Vocational Education and Training (abbreviated TVET) comprises vocational, occupational and Artisan education and training as offered by TVET colleges. For more information on Artisans, see pages 190 to 194.

#### **Programme offerings**

A wide range of courses/programmes that have been developed to respond to the scarce skills needed by employers are offered. Courses

vary in duration from a short course of a few hours to a formal diploma course of three years. Some courses also provide access to Higher Education studies in the same field of study as the qualification obtained from a TVET college and these course offerings range from NQF level 2 to 5 and in a few cases, up to level 6. TVET College course offerings are listed under the green headings in the Programme Choice List section of this handbook from page 34 to 149.

#### **Programme types**

#### Diploma

- Diploma study is vocation based (trade based), and develops career oriented skills and practical knowledge.
- Diploma programmes train high-level person power – people who are ready to start work on completion of their studies.
- Students are instructed through a combination of theoretical study and practical experience, in many cases in an appropriate work situation. Students learn how to apply their knowledge in real-life situations.
- The National Nated Diploma is awarded in the third year following successful completion of 18 months on campus study and 18 months Work Integrated Learning (WIL) experience.

#### Certificate

- Skills-based education for people who may not have completed Grade 12 or may not qualify for diploma study.
- It concentrates on developing trained, skilled and qualified employees by placing a strong emphasis on hands-on training.
- A practical component is part of all courses, often in a real workplace situation.
- Students who complete a certificate programme may be considered for admission to diploma study in related fields.

#### NC(V)

- Skills-based education for people who may not have completed Grade 12 or may not qualify for diploma study.
- It concentrates on developing trained, skilled and qualified employees by placing a strong emphasis on hands-on training.
- Vocational study helps students to develop marketable skills in their chosen vocational field.
- The NC(V) covers three years of study, and a certificate is awarded after each year. A practical component is part of all courses, often in a real workplace situation.
- Students who complete an NC(V) or N4 may be considered for admission to diploma study in related fields at universities of technology or can continue with advanced study.

Your Statement of Symbols or Certificate will indicate if you meet the minimum entry requirements for degree study, which are four subjects from the designated list below at level 4 (50-59%), your home language at level 3 (40-49%), and English at level 2 (30-39%).

Where you see NSC Deg (four subjects at level 4) in the Programme Choice List, this means that you must meet the above requirements. If the institution has additional requirements, it will be indicated:

**Example:** NSC Deg with Maths and Phys Sci 6 and Engl and LO 4 and two subjects 4 from the designated list

This means that in addition to an NSC pass meeting the minimum standard required for entry into degree study, you must have passes in Mathematics and Physical Science at level 6 and English home language, or first additional language and Life Orientation at level 4. Two of the three other subjects must be from the designated list.

#### Diploma study

Your results will indicate if you meet the minimum entry requirements for diploma study, NSC Dip (four subjects at level 3), which are four subjects, including your home language at level 3 (40-49%) and English at level 2 (30-39%). If the institution has additional requirements, it will be indicated:

Example: NSC Dip with Engl HL 4/FAL 5 and Maths 4 and one 20 credit subject (excl. lang) 3

#### 3. Understanding the Programme Choice List continued

This means that in addition to an NSC pass meeting the minimum standard required for entry into a diploma programme, you must have passes with English home language at level 4 or English first additional language at level 5 and Mathematics at level 4. You must have one other subject at level 3, which is not a language.

#### **Senior Certificate**

Minimum entry requirements for applicants who have written their Senior Certificate are shaded lemon.

**Example:** Matric Exemption with Maths 'D' HG/'A' SG and Agric Sci or Biol or Phys Sci 'E' HG/'C' SG

This means that your Senior Certificate or Statement of Symbols must state that you have been granted an 'endorsement'. In addition, you must have passed Mathematics with 'D' on Higher Grade or 'A' on Standard Grade and at least one of Agricultural Science, Biology or Physical Science with 'E' on Higher Grade or 'C' on Standard Grade. If you qualify for an Ordinary Conditional Exemption, you could be considered for programmes specifying 'Matric Exemption', provided the other subject requirements are met.

#### N3/N4

Minimum entry requirements for applicants who have studied at a Technical Vocational Education and Training College (TVET) are shaded mint.

Example: N3 with two main subjects 'D' and Grade 12 Engl SG

This means that you must have an N3 pass. In addition, you must have passed two subjects with 'D' and Grade 12 English on Standard Grade.

#### NC(V)

Minimum entry requirements for applicants who have written National Certificate (Vocational) are shaded lilac.

**Example:**  $\operatorname{NC}(V)$  with two Civil Engineering subjects 5 and Engl and Maths and Phys Sci 4

This means that you must have an NC(V) pass in a relevant learning field. You must have passes in three compulsory vocational subjects at level 5 and English and Maths and Physical Science at level 4.

#### Other requirements

If there are other entry requirements such as an N Dip, the list will tell you what qualification you must have to enter these programmes. If you do not already have this qualification, you should apply for that programme first.

#### Foreign qualifications

The following are considered to be equivalent to the South African degree entry requirements:

#### **GCE**

#### Five passes in GCE as well as two at 'A' level:

- 'A' level passes must be A, B, C, D or E
- 'O' level passes must be A, B or C.

#### Five passes in GCE as well as four at 'AS' level:

- 'A' level passes must be A, B, C, D or E;
- 'O' level passes must be A, B or C; and
- 'AS' level passes must be A, B, C or D.

#### 3. Understanding the Programme Choice List continued

Applicants from SADC countries who have five passes at 'O' level, including English language, may be considered for diploma study.

#### HIGCSE/IGCSE

#### Passes in five subjects, four of which must be at HIGCSE level:

- HIGCSE passes must be 1, 2 or 3; and
- IGCSE passes must be A, B or C.

Applicants who wish to enter degree programmes are required to have passes in English language and one other language, and must usually have also passed Maths.

The Matriculation Board gives details of requirements for those with other qualifications. Applicants should apply for a 'Foreign' or 'Foreign Conditional' Matric Exemption from the Matriculation Board. Institutions will usually assist with this, or you can consult the Matriculation Board directly.

This evaluation is carried out by SAQA (South African Qualifications Authority). If you need to contact SAQA, you must ask for the Quality Assurance Department. The cost of an assessment varies, depending on the level of priority. Conditions are on the SAQA website.

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





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### 1. Find Out what You're Good at

#### How do I decide what to study?

You may be feeling quite stressed out about making this BIG decision and unsure how to choose a career that will be right for you... Well – relax, follow these Self-Help Steps, including the quiz on your working personality, and you'll be a whole lot more equipped to make a good choice when you're done!

Knowing which careers or jobs suit you is a process of discovery. The 'Helping you decide on your career' section is about finding out what you are good at, what kind of person you are, what careers are out there and then matching this information together. It's also about listening to your gut feeling because you are the expert on yourself! Very often you actually know what career directions seem interesting to you, but you may need some confirmation of this in order to feel more confident about your choice.

The CAO has included this section to give you more information to help make your choices. Choosing what to study and knowing what career direction this will lead you to is a really important choice that will affect you for a long time. So, put in the effort to gather the right information about yourself and your career choices.

#### Self-help steps

On a scale of 1 to 10, rate how ready you feel to make a career choice?

















1 means that you feel very unprepared and 10 means you feel you have all the information you need to make a good choice. If you've chosen a number less than 10, you need more preparation, so keep going!

Okay, let's get started with gathering more information to help you to make a good study choice.

#### **Knowing yourself**

To learn more about yourself, you're going to need a pen, no really, you're going to need to go and get a pen; you've got some self exploring to do!

#### Look at the descriptions below.

For each number, choose either the **grey** description or the **red**. Circle the one that sounds most like you.

But be careful – this is not always the case. Find out how much study and memorising versus practical work and in-situation training is involved in the study direction you choose.

#### 1. Find Out what You're Good at continued

Certain types of people match certain types of careers. Sometimes parents, friends or your community may try to push you towards a career that you know you're not right for. Sometimes your friends are all studying something – so you feel you should too. Other times you hear that you might get a bursary for a certain course and this makes you want to choose it. Be careful, as you will spend a large amount of your life working... and working in the wrong job can be stressful and unfulfilling.

Knowing what careers you really wouldn't like to do is VERY important too... Write down five careers you wouldn't like to do. Knowing what you don't want to do is just as important as knowing what you want to do. Perhaps you don't really like the idea of working with and caring for people, so a job in teaching, nursing or social work puts you off. Maybe you don't enjoy working with numbers, so careers in engineering or accounting seem unexciting.

Write down two careers you feel someone else would like you to do that you don't think are really right for you...

Think of the three school subjects you did well in or enjoyed. Write these down. These are strong areas for you and could be used in your future career. Was there a subject you wished you could have taken that was not offered by your school?

#### Which subjects were your least favourite?

When choosing your career, make sure your career does not need you to be good at the things you are not good at! After these seven steps, you've probably put in quite a lot of thought about the kind of person you are. It's so important to 'match' who you naturally are to a career that is

right for you. Continue to fill in the following quiz, which describes four different working personality types. Which one are you?

This next section of Self-Help Steps is about jobs that are out there. This is very important because if you don't know about different careers, you can't make a well informed choice!

#### **Knowing about careers**

On a scale of 1 to 10, rate how much you know about what jobs are out there in the world of work. 1 means you feel you have little knowledge of what jobs exist and 10 means you feel you know quite a bit about the variety of careers there are to choose from.

















If you rated your knowledge as less than a 10, read on to build up your knowledge of careers and improve your score.

**First things first:** to get into a career, you usually need to study. Do you know the difference between NC(V), certificate, diploma and degree study? Do you know about distance learning, and part-time and full-time study options? If not, have a look at pages 186-187.

Okay, let's think about what jobs are out there. Have a look at the 'programme choice list' in this Handbook and read through the career directions. Are there any career directions there that you don't know about? Write these down. Then have a look through the relevant pages in the booklet itself, for example Computer Applications on page 95. You will see that you can study towards different degrees or diplomas in this career direction.

You will notice that there are different entry requirements for these options; they take different amounts of time to complete, and can be studied at different tertiary study institutions. Page 17 tells you exactly how to read and understand the 'Programme Choice List'.

#### So you realise there are some gaps in your career knowledge, but how do you find out more about careers you don't know about? Here are some ideas...

- Ask your Life Orientation (LO) teacher, parent or another adult to explain more about the career directions you're unsure of.
- Perhaps you have a family friend, neighbour or relative who does the job you are interested in finding out more about. Speak to them about their job.
- Use the coupon on page 229 to send away for more information on your institution of choice and the career direction that seems interesting to you. The CAO will inform the respective institutions that you would like more information from them. Have a look at www.pacecareers.com. This great website provides a lot of information about different types of jobs and careers. It also gives you ideas about where to find out further information, such as through professional bodies or associations. Do their extremely helpful quiz to find out more about what careers you might suit.
- You could also look in your school or public library for books on careers.

Now that you've done some research into the career directions, rate which three sound most interesting to you. Look these up in the Programme Choice List to see how to study towards them.

Another way to refine your knowledge of your top three career directions is to speak to people working in these fields. You could phone a company in the industry to find out more. If they are not too busy, people are often very flattered to tell you about what they do. Phone them and say, "...Good morning/afternoon, my name is \_\_\_\_\_ and I want to study towards a career in \_\_\_\_\_. I am trying to find out more about what the career involves on a day-to-day basis. I would really appreciate speaking to someone in this career in your company".

Before you make this call, write down the questions you need to ask, e.g., what do you do on a day-to-day basis; are there jobs available in this career; what is the earning potential; how many hours do you work a week? etc. Remember to thank the person for their time!

You could also phone the institution you are thinking of studying through and ask to speak to their career counsellor. Many institutions have one of these and the service is free of charge. Or you could speak to the Admissions Office for details about the content of programmes. See contact details on pages 206 to 221.

- I have spoken to people who are in the job I am thinking about and I know what the average work day, salary and responsibilities for this job are.
- I know how to use the Programme Choice List and make my application to the CAO.

Congratulations on working through these steps towards making a good career decision! By now you probably feel a lot more confident in your ability to make a good career choice. Read on for a few more tips!

#### Paying for your studies

How you will finance your studies is also a very important thing to think about when making your career choice. There are different ways of doing this:

**Loans** – Most funding is in the form of a loan and loans need to be paid back to the institution you are borrowing from.

**Bursaries** – These are grants or monetary aid given to needy students or students who show good potential. These don't need to be paid back but you may need to work for the company who gave you the bursary for a few years. 

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## 4. Artisanship – What it is and How You can Become an Artisan

#### Why study at a TVET College?

- Do you believe you have a talent to create things with your hands?
- Do you find too much theory without practical application boring?
- Do you want to own a manufacturing factory one day?
- Do you want to fast-track your route to employment?
- Do you want to acquire hands-on skills?
- Did your matric results not qualify you for a Bachelor's entry into university?

If your answer is yes to more than one of the above, then you are at the right place!

#### What are the advantages?

Being an Artisan gives you the opportunity to express your talent through the creation of goods and products with your hands. It is the nature of the Artisan to express his or her through the invention, creation, manufacture, repair and manipulation of things. These can be artistic masterpieces, technological crafts or mechanical devices. The car you drive, the house you live in, the television you watch, the telephone you talk on, the clothes you wear, the furniture and appliances in your home and also the computer this Handbook is busy being developed on. These are things that Artisans have invented, designed, drawn plans for, and built. Artisans are impelled to make things. They get restless if they do not create something tangible. It is in their nature to produce physical objects. They

generate an idea from within themselves and they bring it out into material reality. They take raw material in their hands and fashion it into things of beauty and function.

#### Become an Artisan in seven steps defined Step 1 – Career guidance and management

The implementation of an effective career guidance and management system for trade occupations is essential to ensure that persons wishing to become Artisans, especially young people, fully understand the possibilities, scope and activities of Artisans within industry. A system has been implemented to provide information and market Artisan careers among South Africans to ensure sufficient entrance of learners into Artisan trade occupations. Effective career guidance ensures that entrants will have made informed career choices and career management will facilitate progression to Artisan status and beyond into technician and engineering related occupations.

As part of career management, a professional registration process to enhance the status of Artisans will also be implemented, allowing for Artisan career development opportunities. Career guidance will include, among other things, medical examinations since many Artisan trades are physically demanding. This will ensure a maximum throughput for each of the three occupational learning steps – occupational knowledge, practical and workplace. Furthermore, if supported by entrepreneurial and business management skills, qualified Artisans are able to start up their own small businesses that could have a large impact on unemployment and job creation.

## Step 2 – General, vocational or fundamental knowledge learning

Although Artisan occupations are primarily focused on hand skills

and practical ability, they are supported by a substantial amount of general, vocational or fundamental knowledge learnt through the basic schooling system or at a vocational college. To ensure effective throughput and success rates within occupational learning, strong fundamental knowledge is required of subjects such as Mathematics, Science, Drawing and technical language used in the technical working environment.

This fundamental knowledge will prepare the learners for effective learning and mastering of the three occupational learning components, which form part of Artisan trade training, occupational knowledge, practical and workplace training. The more generic fundamental knowledge is delivered at academic or focus schools as well as at TVET colleges.

At present, there are numerous options being utilised for this generic, vocational, fundamental knowledge, including the National Senior Certificate (Matric) at traditional learning academic or focus schools, as well as the more technical programmes such as the National Technical Education Certificate (NATED) or National Vocational Certificate NC(V) at TVET colleges. More recently, a National Adult Senior Certificate (NASCA) was also released for public comment that offers a further option for this generic, fundamental knowledge.

#### Step 3 – Learner agreement registration and contracting

The next step in becoming a qualified Artisan is to find a workplace approved employer who will enter into a learning programme agreement and contract with the learner after Step 2 (generic or vocational or fundamental knowledge component) has been completed successfully. The employer will apply an industry specific selection process prior

to entering into an agreement and contract with the learner, as they will want to ensure that the learners are fully suited to the industry they want to practise their trade in. Employers are also required to consider national transformation objectives to ensure equity in the workplace, as determined by relevant legislation. The learning programme agreement and contract will be a tripartite agreement between the employer, the learner and accredited training provider. A relevant SETA facilitates and registers the agreement and contract for the duration of the Artisan learning programme.

The conditions of the learning programme agreement and contract are prescribed in the relevant regulations issued by the Minister of Higher Education and Training and will include the agreement duration, completions and termination. They also ensure the protection of a learner under relevant labour laws such as the Basic Conditions of Employment Act (BCEA). This protection under the labour laws is important, both to ensure that learners receive an allowance as determined by a Sectoral Determination for Learnerships and Apprenticeships, but also so that learners are protected under occupational health and safety laws. At present, these regulations are known as the Learnerships Regulations, but these are in the process of being amended to become the Learning Programme Regulations.

A critical part of Step 3 is the allocation of funding for Artisan learners through Grant Payments from SETAs, which forms an integral part of the Learner Agreement and Contract. At present, there is a variety of grant systems and processes in place that has led to considerable confusion and manipulation of Artisan training by different stakeholders. There is also a considerable amount of work in

progress at present with all stakeholders to standardise and simplify the funding and administration system for Artisan learners. The outcomes of this process will continually be communicated to all stakeholders.

#### Step 4 – Occupational knowledge and practical learning

After a learning programme agreement is registered with a relevant SETA and a contract of learning (including funding arrangements) is in place, the Artisan learner then enters an accredited Artisan training centre. The learner then commences with the occupational knowledge and practical learning that is specific to the Artisan trade.

This specific trade occupational knowledge and practical component may be offered by the same or different providers that offered the generic, vocational or fundamental knowledge. This will depend on the accreditation scope of the skills development provider. The specific trade occupational knowledge is contextualised within the learning process to specific tasks required, such as fault finding, manufacturing, repair, services, etc.

The occupational trade knowledge may also have components of mathematics, science, drawing and technical language specific to the trade. Such knowledge is applied to the specific trade occupation as the learner learns and applies the knowledge daily in an integrated fashion. The practical learning that accompanies the occupational knowledge learning contextualises and applies the trade knowledge component to simulated situations in a practical setting in a training centre.

This ensures that learners are effectively prepared for workplace

learning, which follows after the occupational knowledge and practical learning process. The occupational knowledge and practical learning component must be offered at an accredited training centre covering the entire scope of an application to the specific trade. This learning is also known as 'off the job' learning that is progressively and sequentially taught. This ensures that the Artisan learner slowly and systematically gains competencies relevant to his or her trade.

At certain pre-determined stages, there are formative assessments applied, previously known as phase tests, to ensure that learners have assimilated the occupational knowledge and practical skills and can proceed to the next stage. Much of this occupational knowledge and practical learning are simulations of the type of work that the learner will actually engage in once he or she is finally a qualified Artisan.

#### Step 5 - Workplace learning

Real competence in any occupation involves a person applying and transferring learning at the workplace or across a variety of workplaces. Therefore, the most critical component of learning in Artisan development is workplace learning. During the workplace learning process, the occupational knowledge and practical learning assimilated during the previous step is applied in the workplace.

The Artisan learner is exposed to real life situations within the workplace, including all aspects of the Artisan occupation such as work ethics, safety, responsibilities and quality performance of work required by industry. In all Artisan trades, this is the most significant and difficult of the various learning processes and therefore the Artisan learner is supported in the workplace by a qualified workplace mentor, previously known as the journeyman.

These workplace mentors are qualified and experienced Artisans in the same trade the Artisan learner is registered for. In many instances, there is a scarcity of these mentors in the workplace and possible processes are being considered to bring back retired Artisans to fulfil the function of a mentor in the workplace.

The workplace learning process, known as the 'on the job' learning process, allows a learner to progressively and sequentially re-learn what he learnt in the practical learning process but applied in a real workplace.

During the workplace learning, the learner must be exposed to the entire scope of the trade as predetermined by the curriculum of the occupational trade qualification to ensure that once qualified, he or she will fully be competent to become a productive worker in the industry and will only need further specific industry training. Many of the current workplace learning programmes that exist in industry today are based on historic and often outdated training schedules developed under the Manpower Training Act.

Some programmes have been updated as unit standard based programmes and are now delivered as Learnerships in some sectors. The Quality Council for Trades and Occupations, in collaboration with the National Artisan Moderation Body, is progressively updating all these Artisan trade workplace programmes to become occupational-based curriculum and qualifications.

#### Step 6 - Trade testing and recognition of prior learning

Once the Artisan learner has successfully completed the occupational knowledge, practical and workplace learning, the Skills Development Act requires a learner to undergo an external final

summative assessment, also known as a Trade Test, before he or she can be certified as a qualified Artisan, irrespective of the route or pathway of learning the learner utilised.

All trade testing in South Africa will, in the near future, be regulated by national Trade Test Regulations issued under Section 26D(5) of the Skills Development Act that are applicable to all Trade Test Centres, whether they are operated by private, government or state-owned companies. These national, decentralised trade test centres must be accredited by the Quality Council for Trades and Occupations before they will be allowed to conduct national trade tests. The national trade test includes practical tasks that a learner must complete within a specified period of time, as determined by the National Artisan Moderation Body (NAMB).

In addition, all trade testing processes will be monitored and moderated by NAMB as required by Section 26A(2) of the Skills Development Act. The national trade testing system is also being built to include a customised Artisan development aligned Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) system that will offer persons who have assimilated knowledge and skills related to an Artisan trade through workplace activities to also enter a well-supported process that will result in access to a national trade test.

To ensure that trade testing is always relevant to the needs of the industry and to ensure that learners achieve competent Artisan status, all Artisan trade testing or assessment practitioners, including assessors, assessment tool designers and moderators, will be registered by NAMB and be subject to continuous and regular capacity building through reskilling processes.

All accredited trade test centres will report to the NAMB as per pre-determined requirements to enable the NAMB to monitor their performance. In this sense, the NAMB will act as an 'ombudsman' for Artisan development and any concern with regards to the quality of Artisan development may be reported to the NAMB.

#### Step 7 – Assurance and certification

Quality assurance will be built into each and every step of the national 7-Step Programme. It is, therefore, not an isolated activity focusing on the final external summative assessment or trade testing only, but is implemented right from the qualification development, learner selection, accreditation and delivery processes.

The current practice, whereby a range of sector-based trade certificates are issued in South Africa, has been phased out and the development through the National Artisan Moderation Body, under delegation from the Quality Council for Trades and Occupations, will ensure that only national Artisan trade certificates are issued.

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## 5. Applicants with Disabilities

The South African Constitution recognises the human rights of all South Africans, including those with disabilities. Discrimination on the basis of disability is against the law and persons with disabilities are included in the category of previously disadvantaged in terms of the country's transformation agenda. Persons with disabilities therefore, need to be given equal opportunities to access postschool education and training so that they too may achieve their full potential. According to Article 1 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2007) "Persons with disabilities include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others." The South African White Paper on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2015) reiterates the rights of persons with disabilities, including the right to access education at all levels.

School-leavers with disabilities are encouraged to contact organisations of persons with disabilities or the disability rights unit or student support services department of the institution they wish to study at if they have any queries about access to studies. School-leavers with disabilities are also encouraged to inform the institution's disability rights unit or student support department about their access needs prior to beginning their studies so that the necessary reasonable accommodation can be arranged. It is hoped that we will see increasing numbers of students with disabilities at all post school education institutions – it is your right to access education!

## 1. CAO's Communication with You

#### How do I check if my form has been received?

If you want to confirm that your form has been received, you can phone us on 0860 860 CAO/226 (or dial +27 31 268 4444 from outside South Africa) or check 'My Application' on our website www.cao.ac.za.

#### How will I know when my application has been processed?

You will receive an email/SMS message notifying you that your application has been processed. Thereafter, you will receive an acknowledgement letter. Allow up to 15 working days after we receive your application for it to be processed.

Please contact us if you do not receive this acknowledgement letter within four weeks after you have sent your application. Any special information the institution wishes applicants to know will be included with the details of your choices (if any).

#### How do I check the status of my application?

Once your details are on our database, it will be easy for us to answer queries. If you have given us your email address or cell phone number,

we shall send you a message when your form has been processed. You can check the status of your application on our website www.cao.ac.za by selecting 'My Application' and entering your CAO number or your ID or passport number. This information can be printed if you have access to a printer.

You can also phone the CAO on Share Call 0860 860 CAO/086 086 0226 (or dial +27 31 268 4444 from outside South Africa) to find out whether your application has been processed, or to check the status of your programme choices.

If you have given us an email address or have a fax number, you can request a summary letter. ## 2. Institutions' Communication with You

#### Who makes selection decisions?

Institutions make selection decisions. The CAO does NOT make selection decisions but provides your information to the institutions.

#### When are offers made?

Institutions make selection decisions at various times in the year.

#### How will I know if I have been selected?

If you have given us your email address or cell phone number, we will send you a message when a decision is made on any of your programme choices. As soon as you are made an offer, we will communicate this to you. Some institutions may also send you letters or messages informing you of your offer. Make sure you let us know if you change your contact details by emailing changeofcontactcao@cao.ac.za or faxing to 086 625 2116.

#### How do I accept an offer?

You must inform the institution and NOT the CAO about whether you wish to accept the offer. They should send you a letter or message detailing the procedures you must follow. If they give you a deadline to accept a place, it is important that you reply within that time or the place will be offered to someone else. Most institutions will ask you to pay a non-refundable Acceptance of Offer fee to secure your place. This fee will usually count towards your registration and tuition fees. PLEASE DO NOT pay this money to the CAO. Consult the institution with regards to the details of how and when you need to respond and pay by.

#### How do I decline an offer?

If you have decided not to accept the offer, please communicate this directly to the respective institution.

#### What happens after I have accepted an offer?

Once you have accepted a place and paid the deposit requested, the institution should send you details of registration. First semester registration takes place between the second week of January and the beginning of February. Second semester registration takes place between June and August. Check the institutions' websites for details.

#### Where do I send my application as an international applicant?

- If you are applying for short-term study, apply directly to the institution.
- If you are applying to **UKZN** only, apply directly to the institution.
- For other institutions and choices at more than one institution, apply through the CAO. Email to formsreceivedcao@cao.ac.za or fax to +27.31.268.4422.

#### How do I apply as an international applicant?

An international applicant is a person who is not a citizen or permanent resident of South Africa, or a refugee/asylum seeker with a permit allowing study. The higher education institutions of KwaZulu-Natal welcome applications from international applicants for their formal degree, diploma and certificate programmes. Some institutions also offer the opportunity to study in South Africa for one semester or one year. DUT and UKZN do not accept international applicants into their access programmes. Applications to study Medicine at UKZN are considered ONLY from citizens of Lesotho and Mauritius and applicants must apply via their governments. You will require a study permit if you wish to come to South Africa to study. This does not apply to distance learning students who study in their home countries.

Once you have a letter offering you a place from the further or higher education institution, you can apply to the South African embassy, high commission, consulate or trade office for your study permit. The permit application will take up to eight weeks to be processed. Acceptance by an institution does not place any obligation on the South African government to issue or renew study permits. DO NOT leave home before your study permit is granted – you will not be allowed to study on a visitor's permit. You cannot apply for your first permit after you arrive in South Africa. People who are in South Africa for study purposes are not eligible to apply for South African citizenship. Refugee and asylum seeker applicants require documentation from the Department of Home Affairs granting permission to study in South Africa.

## How do I change my programme choices (Change of Mind, also referred to as a COM)?

If at any time you want to replace one or more of your programme choices with others or change the sequence, complete a 'Change of Mind' Request Form, which can be downloaded from our website www.cao.ac.za. Alternatively email formrequestcao@cao.ac.za or call 0860 860 CAO/226 to request a copy.

A fee of R110.00 will be charged for each request to add, renumber or remove programme choices, to cover the cost of the administrative work involved. No change of mind will be processed until the full Change of Mind fee has been received.

Any number of programme changes (up to six programmes) on the same Change of Mind (COM) Request Form is considered as one for payment purposes.

If you submit qualification/programme changes on more than one COM Request Form and/or at different times, each COM Request Form submission will be regarded as a separate request and a fee must be paid for each submission, not for each qualification/programme change.

Payment/s for multiple COM request form submissions will be allocated to, and processed strictly in the sequence that the COM Request Forms were received.


